

'Ready to Learn' expectations

We expect all pupils to follow our three St. Katherine's Ready to Learn expectations:

- Be responsible by arriving on time and fully equipped
- Be respectful by listening and speaking politely
- Be resilient by remaining on task and working hard



What happens if a pupil is not 'Ready to Learn'?

- For example: arriving late to the lesson and disturbing the learning or talking and disturbing the learning
 - a teacher will tell them that they have a "warning"
 and their name will be recorded
 - If a pupil does this for a second time, they will be sent to the Ready to Learn room for a full day i.e. 5 periods (After phased introduction in Term 1)

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


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



All students have been given a username of the form <u>username@skdrive.org</u>.
